&lt;p&gt;Londrina Esporte Clube, more commonly referred to as Londrina, is a Bra  
zilian &#128737; professional association football club in Londrina, Paran&#225  
;, which currently plays in S&#233;rie B, the second tier of Brazilian football,  
after &#128737; being promoted from S&#233;rie C in 2020.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;They also play in the Campeonato Paranaense, the top division of the Pa  
ran&#225; state &#128737; football league.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club was founded on April 5, 1956, and originally played at the Vit  
orino Gon&#231;alves Dias stadium.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Their current stadium, &#128737; the Est&#225;dio do Caf&#233; was bui  
lt for Londrina&#39;s participation in the 1976 Brazilian league championship.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The most successful period for Londrina &#128737; came between 1976 an  
d 1982 when Londrina competed in Brazil&#39;s top league for 6 seasons.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;They were relegated for the 1980 &#128737; season but claimed their on  
ly national league title by becoming champions of the second division.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;They have also won the state &#128737; championship four times, as wel  
l as claiming 12 Campeonato do Interior Paranaense titles.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;In 2013, Londrina finished in top place in &#128737; the general class  
ification of the Campeonato Paranaense.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Although they did not qualify for the state championship final they won  
the Interior &#128737; final and thereby qualified for a place in the Campeona  
to Brasileiro S&#233;rie D, the fourth tier of the Brazilian league &#128737; s  
ystem and will also be placed in the draw for the first round of the Copa do Bra  
sil.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;History [ edit &#128737; ]&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Londrina was founded by a group of sportsmen who, after watching a frie  
ndly match between Nacional and Vasco da Gama &#128737; in Rol&#226;ndia, decid  
ed that they did not want to go to Rol&#226;ndia to watch football.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Instead, they founded a club in &#128737; Londrina, their own city.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club, named Londrina Futebol e Regatas, was founded on April 5, 195  
6.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;They chose blue and white &#128737; to be Londrina&#39;s colors.[1]&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;In 1969, Londrina Futebol e Regatas merged with Paran&#225; Esporte Clu  
be, founded in 1942, forming Londrina Esporte &#128737; Clube.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;[2] Red and white, the colors for the city of Londrina, became the new  
club&#39;s colors.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;In 1972, Carlos Ant&#244;nio Franchello &#128737; returned to the pres  
idency of the club, and restored blue and white as the club&#39;s colors [2]&lt;/p&gt;
